10	May 26	Independence Day	Damouk'ideblobis dghe	On May 26, 1918 National Council of Georgia declared national independence of Georgian people and creation of Democratic Republic of Georgia. The statehood of Georgia was restored after 117 years (from 1801)

12	October 14	Day of Svetitskhoveli Cathedral (in Mtskheta)	Mtskhetoba (Svetitskovloba)	Celebration of first Christian church in Georgia. According to chronicles, holy chyton (shirt) of Savior is buried under this church.
13	November 23	Saint George's Day	Giorgoba	Saint George (in Georgian: 'tsminda giorgi') is a patron saint of Georgia
